This is a drawing of New Zion Church as built in 1875.

New Zion Church stands in the north east corner of Sec. 30-69-20, Benton township along the south side of highway No. 3. Six years before the outbreak of the Civil War a Methodist class was organized in a log school house near the Hazel Dell Cemetery.

Names on the charter class roll were; Garrett, Allen, King, Rodgers, Dean, Thomas and Hill.

The first meeting place was log throughout, including the seats. It was here people for miles around came to worship God once each month. A large family riding behind an ox team was a regular sight.

Rev. Swim, Spooner of Chariton, Hartley Bracewell of Allerton, and Bennett of Corydon, Welsh, Baker, Watson, Patterson, were early day preachers. These were "traveling" or "Circuit Rider" pastors, who usually made their appearance two or three days before preaching on Sunday, staying in the homes. Uncle Billy Troster always gave sincere testimonials "fresh from the Lord."

Several years after class organization a modern School house was erected one mile east and a little south of present New Zion, and the place of worship was changed. The school house burned and services then were held in the McConnell barn or the grove as weather permitted.

From these humble beginnings a vision of a Church of their own developed and they celebrated July 4, 1875 by letting the contract for building, and the church was dedicated in October of 1875. A deed to the land was received from Amos Feigh and wife Annie, for \$1.00 and contained a revertable clause.

In 1904 Nannie Boise was instrumental in organizing the first Epworth League and became its first president

The first Daily Bible School was held during the pastorate of the Rev. H.A. Cottrill in 1926-28.

The church has sent out a very creditable band of Christian workers. They are; Lon Barthelow, Walter Edie and Mr. and Mrs. Fran Wolfe as pastors, - Hannah Binau, Deaconess and Earl Bellon, preparing for Christian service.

In 1905, fifty years since dedication a letter sent to Mrs. Frank Lohr contained a testimonial from Dr. Wm E. Flesher, Oklahoma City, Okla., as follows; "Those were days of character building for me, I did not realize it at the time, but now I see it was a glorious privilege to grow up in a christian community of such high standards of living. During that time my ideals of living were crystallized and it has been a great help to me in meeting temptations as the years have passed."

Thus the families of this church have played a vital part in the spiritual life of the county and they can truly say "God is with us."

New Zion Church observed its 100 year Centennial, Sept. 18, 1955. The dedication centennial sermon was preached by a former pastor Rev. H.A. Cottrill who was there in 1926 to 28.

A crowd of over 200 attended the Centennial. In 1967 the Church gave the Bell to the Wayne County Historical Societies Museum.

Rev. Sterrett died while he was still pastor in 1969.
