

Corydon Old School Presbyterian Church

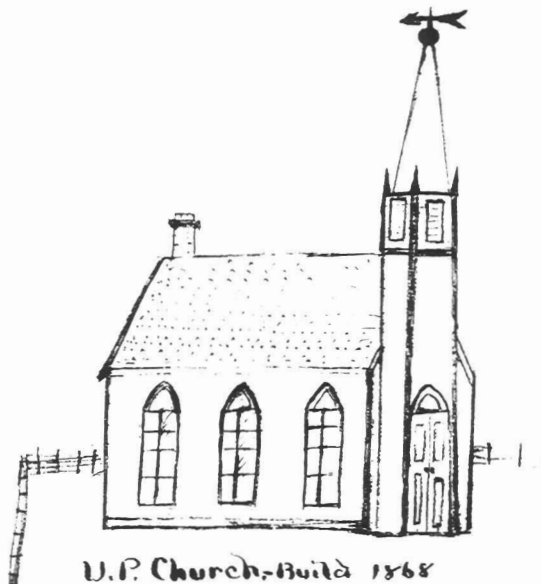


This church was organized in 1857. T.W. Riley purchased an unfinished church from the Disciples society and presented it to the Presbyterians. Rev. J.P. Bringle, formerly from Decatur county, served the society from its organization until 1882, when he resigned. Since then W.P. Braddock preached in 1884, and W.M. Devoe in 1885. There were no services in 1886. W.P. McClanahan was last Sunday School superinten-

dent. An item from the news paper dated Feb. 1911 says "Dick Oglesby's" Bell ringers gave a very satisfactory entertainment to a fair sized audience at the Corydon Presbyterian church. (Looking backward 32 years) which would be 1879.

Corydon United Presbyterian Church

The United Presbyterian church was organized in 1857. They held occasional services in the old court house until the following year, when they built a frame church in the northern part of the village, at a cost of \$2,200. The Rev. Leonard Proudfit was minister to the

congregation from 1867 to 1885. Since then no services have been held. The church was built in 1868.
